Plan to attend the Make Conference, led by teachers, for teachers.

Learn what technical writing you may already be doing in your classroom, how to further develop writing strategies, and what assessment can look like in the process.

All sessions will include relevant technical writing exercises facilitated by a Missouri Writing Project teacher consultant.

Two-Hour Sessions:

Session 1 Making Holograms — With the help of a laser/photronics teacher, reconstruct an object in space using lasers. Double session.

Session 2 Website Design — A teacher will guide participants through website creation and all the writing that entails. Double session.

One-Hour Sessions (Choose two):

Session 3 Culinary Creations — A pastry chef will introduce the art of dessert-plating, presentation, and menu writing.

Session 4 Robotics/Electronics — Learn how to build simple circuits and program a robot for movement.

Session 5 Medical — A pre-hospital provider will take participants through a report writing involving a patient that has been injured and transported to a medical facility.
